

17. **THE HABBALLAH.**— A plaited candle in stand; lit at end of Sabbath to show that the law forbidding a fire is passed for another week.
18. **THE KIDDUSH CUP** (or 'the cup of blessing').— Part of the Habballah service. The blue cloth upon which it stands is the Hallah cloth, bearing the words, 'Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy'. Special bread is placed on this to commemorate the double portion of manna which fell on the sixth day.
19. **SPICE BOX.**— Used in the Habballah service at close of Sabbath service.
20. **MACHZOR** (or prayer book).— See No. 30.
21. **MEGILLAH.**— Small ornamental scroll of the book of Esther in jewelled silver case. Used at Feast of Purim.
22. **SHOPHAR** (or ram's horn trumpet).— Used at New Year and Day of Atonement.
- 23, 24. **JEWELLED POINTER AND BREASTPLATE.**— (Lent by Great Synagogue). See No. 2.
25. **TEPHILIN** (or phylacteries).— Deuteronomy 6:8.
26. **MEZUZAH.**— Deuteronomy 6:60.
27. **SYAGOGUE.**— Photograph showing women's grating and ark.
28. **MOTZAH** (or unleavened bread).— Used at Passover (and first 'Lord's Supper').
29. **SLIPPER LAMP.**— Used at anniversary of father's death; engraved with the fifth commandment.
30. **MACHZOR** (or prayer book).— Cologne 1525.
31. **LULABIM** (or palm).— Used at Feast of Tabernacles. Observe little pocket at end for holding sprigs of willow and myrtle.
32. **ETHROG** (or citron).— Used at Feast of Tabernacles.
- 32a. **TALITH.**— Worn beneath clothing.
33. **BREAD.**— Made in rings.
34. **CLOTH.**— This covers reading desk.
35. **HEBREW TEXT.**— 'Pray for the peace of Jerusalem'.
